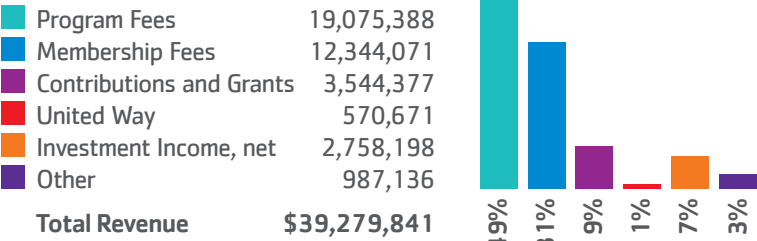

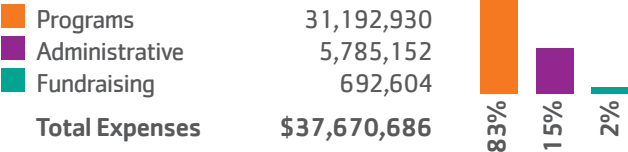

OUR RAY OF SUNSHINE: JOE STUMP

Creating confidence, connection and purpose through inclusion.

Joe Stump has become a familiar face at the Heart of the Valley YMCA. Through a partnership with VPI, a local nonprofit that helps individuals with disabilities and other barriers build skills and find meaningful opportunities, Joe volunteers at the Y as part of the Community Career Connections program.

On paper, Joe's role may sound simple. He helps with laundry, folds towels, puts supplies away and assists with daily tasks around the Y. But ask the staff, and they'll tell you his impact reaches far beyond the laundry room.

"We fold and wash thousands of towels every day, but Joe's impact goes far beyond that," said Brenda Johnson, Executive Director of the Heart of the Valley YMCA. "His positive attitude, friendly presence and willingness to help create a welcoming experience for our members and staff. Joe makes our Y a better place."

For the Y, the partnership with VPI creates opportunities for individuals of all abilities to contribute in meaningful ways and become part of something larger than themselves. For Joe, it has become much more than a volunteer position.

Over the past few years, staff have watched him grow in confidence and step naturally into a leadership role. He notices things that need attention, engages with members, and brings energy wherever he goes.

"He does so much more than fold towels," Brenda shared. "He comes in like a ray of sunshine every time he walks through the doors. Members are happy to see him. Staff are happy to see him."

Joe's VPI support team has seen that growth too. While workplace skills are important, they say one of the most meaningful changes has been social.

"He's basically a celebrity here," they said. "Everyone knows Joe. He talks with everyone and puts smiles on people's faces. Those social connections matter, and he's doing a wonderful job."

For Joe, the feeling is simple.

"I love it," he said. "I love being here. This is joyful for me."

At the Y, community is built through relationships—and Joe reminds us that every person has gifts to share and an important role to play.

Behind every story is a community that makes it possible. Your generosity helps the YMCA create spaces where people can grow stronger, build connections and discover what's possible.

FOR HEALTHY LIVING

FROM PAIN TO POSSIBILITY

How the Y helped Ellen reclaim her strength and live without limits.

For years, Ellen Pennings lived with painful muscle issues that affected nearly every part of her life. Severe cramping could strike unexpectedly and last for hours, making simple activities difficult and leaving her feeling weaker over time.

Then, in 2022, a frightening experience became a wake-up call. While swimming, Ellen nearly drowned.

"It was very scary," she said. "I knew I was getting weaker and I needed to do something drastic to get help."

When Ellen saw information about personal training and health coaching at the YMCA, she was skeptical. Personal training felt like something meant for athletes or fitness enthusiasts—not someone struggling with muscle pain and mobility challenges.

"I thought, I'm not a muscle person," Ellen recalled with a laugh. "I really didn't know if someone could help me with what I was dealing with." One phone call changed everything.

Ellen was connected with Katie Schalk at the Y, who immediately assured her that they would find a way forward together. Rather than focusing only on exercise, Katie recognized that Ellen needed a more personalized approach. Together, they combined Advanced Health Coaching and personal training to uncover what might be contributing to Ellen's symptoms and create a plan built specifically around her needs.

"All these things I wanted to do before, I thought there was no way," Ellen said. "Now I know I can."

"We had to become health detectives," Katie said. "We wanted to understand why the cramping was happening and figure out how to help." Over time, they discovered contributing factors, made adjustments and built strength step by step. As Ellen's health improved, so did her confidence.

Today, her severe cramping has largely disappeared, and goals that once felt impossible suddenly feel within reach.

When she first began at the Y, Ellen worried she might never be physically strong enough to eventually undergo a needed knee replacement. Now she has set her sights on something much bigger.

Next year, Ellen plans to walk across Spain.

"All these things I wanted to do before, I thought there was no way," she said. "Now I know I can."

For Ellen, the experience became about much more than fitness.

"I was worth the investment," she said. "Whatever the challenge is—mobility, balance, strength—things can improve."

At the YMCA, wellness means more than helping people exercise. It means meeting people where they are, helping them discover what's possible and walking alongside them as they pursue goals they once thought were out of reach.

ESPORTS CHAMPIONSHIP

In April 2025, the YMCA of the Fox Cities hosted its inaugural Fox Cities Esports Championship in partnership with Lifest and EdgeVR. Held inside the Miron Gym at the Neenah-Menasha YMCA, the event brought together 90 players for an exciting Fortnite tournament experience.

To create the atmosphere of a major esports competition, the tournament featured a 16-foot video wall streaming live gameplay throughout the event, along with a high-energy emcee who kept players and spectators engaged from start to finish.



In addition to the main tournament, participants enjoyed a variety of interactive activities, including Open Play in the Tech Lab, a Geometry Dash competition sponsored by Renewal by Andersen, and an immersive VR arena hosted by EdgeVR in the Martial Arts Studio.

Esports programming gives young people a safe, moderated place to develop teamwork, leadership, strategic thinking, problem-solving and responsible online behavior.

The championship concluded with the crowning of the tournament winner, who took home a PlayStation 5 grand prize.

Following the overwhelming success of this inaugural event, we are excited to continue building momentum as we look ahead to next year's championship on April 25.
